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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Here we are January, 2024 a start of a new year here at the Bluffs. I wish to welcome all of our new and returning residents. With new residents I get some questions about the property. First off is about our own Lake Mary Jane and is it a spring fed lake? Sorry it is not spring fed.



Our lake started as a pond on the east end and was dredged out to create the Bluffs. The water source is ground water with a large inlet on the west end which takes water from the ditches along US 27. Water under also flows the highway from properties west of US 27, including parts of Sun 'N Lake. The overflow outlet is the silver box between K building and Villa 7 where the water flows into an underground

culvert south, to an open drainage ditch which runs behind the homes Grouper to Lake Sebring. Our lake is between ten and eleven acres in size and was after the named developers' wife, thus Lake Mary Jane was born. The upper and lower ponds are purely decorative. Water is pumped from the lake up to the waterfalls in the upper pond which fills the pond. When it is full, water flows down to the lower pond. Once the lower pond is full, there is an overflow drain which returns the water to the lake. The source of our drinking water is the city of Avon Park. The city bought the water treatment plant behind M building a

number of years ago shut it down and moved us to the main treatment plant. The sanitary system flows to the east end of the property to a large lift station and two pumps send it to a private treatment plant which was just recently bought by a new operator. The new operator has been making The improvements. watering system does not run off city water but is supplied by our own deep well. The well and pump system is located in the shop yard. The water, irrigation and waste water systems on our property are maintained by our maintenance people. One system we do need help with is the security lights; if you see a light out, please put in a work order so it can be attended to. The building lights are taken care of by our staff. The street lights are maintained by Duke, the office must contact Duke directly to repair. request Please remember, our staff are not on property after dark and

may not be aware of the problem. I hope you all have a wonderful new year.


